

Report Launching Webinar: Overview about the multi-stakeholder coalitions by the Réseau Action Climat

Context: the French NGO [Réseau Action Climat](#) worked during 2020 on multi-stakeholder coalitions, and publish its first report on the topic on the 16.11.2020. Since almost a decade now, multi-stakeholder coalitions are more visible and active on climate and environment protection. In order to implement the Paris Agreement, state and non-state actors are trying to coordinate, among others through these coalitions. But what is the role for these coalitions inside the international climate governance? What are their objectives, governance structures and their impacts? Are there potential risks concerning especially impacts, since these coalitions have rarely an evaluation system?

The *Réseau Action Climat* is organising a webinar for the publication of its report, in order to present the key results but also to discuss them with several experts and with the participants.
